

## OFFICIAL MINUTES OF CABINET MEETING.\*

Minutes of Business Meeting

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Immediate Past District Governor Robert Showers.

The prayer was presented by Chaplain Earl Buchholz.

Song Leader Earl Buchholz led "The Star Spangled Banner".

The introductions of Cabinet Members and guests followed.

All were welcomed by District Governor Gordon Hoffman who then made some opening remarks. He then presented the Past District Governor's plaque to Immediate Past District Governor Robert Showers.

Region Chairman John Damrow and his wife Merry escorted the ladies to another meeting room where Merry led them in several activities.

Roll call was taken and the attendance is shown on a seperate page which is attached to these minutes.

Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Orv Doede read communications from the excused cabinet members.

Motion by IPDG Bob Showers, seconded by PDG Glenn Murty to approve the minutes of the last cabinet meeting. Motion carried.

Immediate Past Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Clayton Sengbusch presented the final financial report for fiscal year 1991-92. Motion by RC Chuck Taylor, seconded by IPDG Bob Showers to approve the final financial report. Motion carried.

Immediate Past Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Clayton Singbusch also presented the Audit Report for fiscal year 1991-92.

A standing ovation was given for a job well done by Clayton Sengbusch.

Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Orv Doede presented the proposed 1992-93 budget. Motion by RC Chuck Taylor, seconded by IPDG Bob Showers to approve the 1992-93 budget. Motion carried. A copy is attached.

Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer Orv Doede then presented a current financial statement as of August 1, 1992. Motion by ZC Mark Heller, seconded by PR Chairman Peter Gregouire to approve that statement. Motion carried. A copy of that statement is also attached to these minutes.

Motion by RC John Damrow, seconded by PR Chairman Peter Gregouire to approve the National Exchange Bank & Trust of Fond du Lac as our bank depository. Motion carried.

Motion by Leo Clubs Chairman Jim Roberts, seconded by ZC Orville Kittel to approve the 1992-93 dues and billing as shown in the budget. Carried.

IPDG Bob Showers gave a report on the 1992 state convention at Wausau. Statistics on that convention were published in his newsletter.

Page 2. 8-2-92 Cabinet Minutes .

ZC Mark Heller gave a status report on the 1993 State Convention to be held in Two Rivers. He is the Chairman of the Convention Corporation.

PDG Paul Tadych reported on plans for the 1993 International Convention (to be held in Minneapolis. He advised that there may be a shortage of rooms in the Wisconsin Headquarters hotel and suggested a procedure for room reservations. (NOTE: A few days after the Cabinet Meeting District Governor Gordon Hoffman contacted State Secretary Debi Lutz and advises as follows: "Do not call Debi Lutz at State Headquarters, she is not responsible for your hotel reservations. Make your room reservations to Lions International early. State you would like to be in the Wisconsin delegate hotel, but do not put down the name of the hotel because Lions International has not made a final determination. More information will appear in the Wisconsin Lions Magazine.")

IPDG Bob Showers gave a report on the Ambulance Fund. He said the fund is on deposit in the Montello State Bank with two signatures required for withdrawals. The signature card lists Robert Showers, Dwaine Habrat and Clayton Sengbusch as authorized for withdrawals. The current fund balance is \$7,205.18 including interest through June 1992.

After considerable discussion, there was a motion by ZC Mark Heller, seconded by PDG John Coleman to include the current Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer on the list of authorized signatures for withdrawals from the ambulance fund. Motion carried.

Motion by ZC Mark Heller, seconded by PDG Tom Koch that the ambulance fund be deposited in a financial institution as directed by the current District Governor; that the purchase of an ambulance and the withdrawal of funds from the ambulance fund be authorized subject to the approval of three of the four committee members with the requirement that one of the three be the current Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer. Motion carried.

PDG Dwaine Habrat explained the mechanics and schedule for the trip to Tuxpan, Mexico with the ambulance. It was pointed out that \$50.00 seed money must be sent to Mexico for advertising that our group will be coming with used eyeglasses, etc. Motion by PDG Paul Tadych, seconded by PR Chairman Peter Gregouire that instead of taking the \$50.00 from the ambulance fund, the Tail Twister take up a special collection from this Cabinet for the seed money. Motion carried.

(NOTE: the \$50.00 was collected and turned over to the committee.)

District Governor Gordon Hoffman outlinned his goals for 1992-93. He stressed the need for membership development. He said new members are urgently needed, but emphasized the importance of a strong membership retention program. He also outlinned the SightFirst and Campaign SightFirst programs and advised that we will hear a great deal about these programs during the next several months.

Lion Glen Reiss, substituting for Convention Chairman PDG Clem Schoenborn, reported on the status of the October 23, 24 and 25, 1992 District 27-Bl Convention at the Holiday Inn at Manitowoc which is being hosted by the Cleveland Lions Club. He distributed packets to the Region Chairmen and Zone Chairmen which include information on housing, hospitality booths and ads for the convention booklet.

Election Chairman Lion Karen Koch reported that she has received nomination papers from Lion Ken Rohde for District Governor; Lion Clayton Sengbusch for Lieutenant Governor; and PDG Robert Showers and PDG Paul Tadych for Director of the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. She said she still needs nominations for 1993 bowling and for both 1993 and 1994 district convention hosts. She advised that the deadline for filing nominations is September 22, 1992.

Resolutions Chairman PDG Dwaine Habrat reported that no resolutions have been received for this years District Convention. The deadline for submission of resolutions is September 22, 1992. He also advised that up-dated copies of our District Constitution and By-Laws will be available for distribution at the October District Convention if no new resolutions are submitted for consideration and shortly after the convention if there are resolutions on the ballot.

Diabetes Chairman Carl Knox advised that the Diabetes Camp located near Brothertown has apparently been sold to others.

Bowling Chairman Lion Sandy Polzin reported that the 1992 District Bowling Tournament will be hosted by the Hilbert Lions Club. She added that letters have been sent to all Lions Clubs and Lioness Clubs in Region 2 advising them of their eligibility to host the 1993 Bowling Tournament. The deadline for submissions is September 22, 1992.

Pin Chairman RC John Damrow said our trading pin inventory consists of 71992 pins, 674 1991 pins and 344 1990 pins. He added that he needs design submissions for our 1993 pin and the deadline is October 1, 1992.

Motion by ZC Mark Heller, seconded by PDG Herb Schneider to sell the remaining 1990 and 1991 pins for \$1.00 each. Motion carried.

Motion by PDG Bob Showers, seconded by ZC Mark Heller to contribute 50 1990 pins and 50 1991 pins for distribution during the ambulance trip to Mexico. Motion carried.

Drug & Alcohol Chairman PDG Paul Tadych advised that he is available to put on a Lions Quest program for any club or zone.

Environmental Chairman, Lion Pat Harder advised that in order to keep the air clear and healthy, he has nothing new to report.

Hearing & Speech Chairman PDG Clem Schoenborn is excused.

Mistorian PDG Orv Doede had nothing new to report.

International Relations Chairman PID Edward Eick is excused.

Journey for Sight (Lensometer) Chairman PDG Paul Tadych reported that there is currently \$2,322.00 in the Lensometer fund and he has \$733.00 worth of Lions Mints on had which have realy been sold to a Lions Club, making a total of \$3,055.00 available. His latest information is that the lensometer will probably cost \$4,350.00. He is confident we will easily raise the remaining \$1,295.00, especially after some publicity in the District Governor's newsletter.

PDG Paul also advised that the Packwaukee Lions Club, Fairwater Lions Club and the Butte des Morts Lions Club have each offered their Lions clubhouses for housing the Lensometer and for space to wash, grade and package the used eyeglasses. Motion by ZC Mark Heller, seconded by PR Chairman Peter Gregouire to select Butte des Morts. Motion carried.

SightFirst Chairman PDG Orv Doede said he is available for presenting SightFirst programs. He added that there will be a combined SightFirst/Campaign SightFirst seminar at the District Convention. PDG Paul Tadych who is Campaign SightFirst coordinator for five districts including ours advised that he will be available for that seminar, along with PID Helmer Lecy who is the regional coordinator for Campaign SightFirst covering several mid-western multiple districts.

Wisconsin Lions Foundation President PDG Herb Schneider advised that the Foundation has appointed a sub-committee to investigate the dised eyeglasses program, including the lensometer project with the hope that a state wide policy can be developed to resolve the confusion which now exists because of the present program and programs being considered or set up by several districts in our state.

A short break was taken at 3:04 P.M. and the meeting reconvened at 3:22 P.M.

L.C.I.F. Chairman PDG Bob Showers advised that five new Melvin Jones Fellowship recipients have been selected and the awards will be presented during our October District Convention in Manitowoc. He also said he is available for L.C.I.F. Programs at clubs or zones.

Leader Dog Chairman PDG Glenn Murty reported that this past year, 100% of the Clubs in our District made contributions to Leader Dog for the second straight year. However, the total amount of the contributions was down from the previous year. He added that one Leader Dog came to our District and 13 Leader Dogs came to Wisconsin during this past year. He said he is available to put on programs.

Leadership & Indoctrination Chairman PDG Dennis Kitchen gave a detailed report on last year's leadership, officer training and new member indoctrination meetings and recommended a change in the format. A copy of that report is attached to these minutes. Motion by PDG Dwaine Habrat, seconded by PR Chairman Peter Gregouire to change the format of leadership training and go for a one-day - all day seminar. Motion carried.

Leo Clubs Chairman Jim Roberts said "H E L P", there are no Leo Clubs in our District. He advised that he is available to any club or any zone at anytime to talk about Leo Clubs.

Lion & Lioness Extension, Region 1 & 2 Chairman PDG Victor Voigt excused.

Lion & Lioness Extension, Region 3 & 4 Chairman PDG Milt Wood thanked everyone that came to his appreciation day. He reported that he and another Lion in this room are very near to completing the organizing of another new Lions Club and expect it to be accomplished by our District Convention time.

Lions Information Chairman Don Roeh advised that he has info available on the back table. He added that the 1992-93 International Directory will be available in October

Lioness Associate Lioness Cindy Buchanan and Lioness Liaison Lion Steve Buchanan are both excused. District Governor Gordon Hoffman advised that the State Council passed a motion that the Wisconsin Lions support the Lioness. The Lioness name and emblem can only be used at the Club level and above the Club level they will be called Associates. They can not use the Lioness name and emblem above the Club level.

Membership Orientation & Retention Chairman PDG Tom Koch said he needs the names of all the Zone Membership Liaisons from the Zone Chairmen. He reminded everyone present that they are all on the Membership Team.

Public Relations Chairman Peter Gregouire reported that it is a constant battle to get timely articles in the State Lion Magazine. He added that he urges more professionalism in the magazine.

Sight Conservation/Eye Bank Chairman Bill Holbrook is excused. PDG Herb Schneider advised that Lion Bill is entering a hospital tonight for surgery.

Tail Twister Irv Korth has been active all through the meeting. He reported that the \$50.00 seed money for the ambulance trip to Mexico has been collected.

Wisconsin Lions Foundation Director PDG Herb Schneider is President of the Foundation this year. He presented appreciation pins to last Year's Region Chairmen and Zone Chairmen for their help in making our District 100% in contributions to the Foundation last year. He reported that PDG Tom Thorson has been appointed State SightFirst Chairman. Wisconsin Lions Foundation Director PDG Tom Thorson outlinned the structure of the Sight Conservation Committee, on which he serves, and his responsibilities as the State SightFirst Chairman. He advised that there will be a Parade of Checks during our District Convention and urged the Region Chairmen and Zone Chairmen to suggest to the Clubs that contributions to the Foundation be increased to keep up with inflation and the increase in costs.

Youth Exchange Chairman Del Peterson presented a detailed youth exchange report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. He added that any contribution for youth exchange is appreciated.

District Governor Advisory Board member PDG John Coleman said there are four members on the Advisory Board and if anyone wants some advice, just let them know.

District Governor Gordon Hoffman reminded us that the USA/Canada Forum is getting close. He pointed out the benefits of attending the Forum and said literature and registration forms are on the front table.

District Governor Gordon Hoffman advised that he distributed State Directories and State Constitutions with the packets to the Region Chairmen and Zone Chairmen. All errors discovered should be disclosed to DG Gordy so corrections can be published in the newsletter. The Directories and Constitutions should be distributed to the Presidents and Secretaries as soon as possible.

The Region Chairmen and Zone Chairmen each gave a brief report. Many indicated that membership development and retention would receive emphasis this year. Several have set the date for their first Zone Meeting.

District Governor Gordon Hoffman requested that he be advised of the date, time and location of each zone meeting so he can attend as many as possible.

1993-94 District Governor Candidate, Lion Ken Rohde said he would be happy to see us all at the District Convention.

It was agreed that disposition of the Tail Twister receipts will be decided at the next Cabinet meeting.

Motion by RC Chuck Taylor, seconded by PR Chairman Peter Gregouire to adjourn. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 P.M.

After an Attitude Adjustment hour, dinner was served at 5:30 P.M. to 50 cabinet members, spouses, friends and guests.

17 t h ANNUAL CONVENTION WISCONSIN DISTRIC OCTOBER 23. 2 4 & 2 5 1992 HOLTDAY INN MANITOWOC

Hosted by the Cleveland Lions Club, Inc.

The Friday, October 23rd activities consisted of registration, delegate certification, pin trading and hospitality during the afternoon and evening.

Hospitality booths were arranged around the perimeter of the Grand Ballroom of the Holiday Inn. They were sponsored by supporters of candidates for District Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Wisconsin Lions Foundation Director plus Clubs wishing to host the 1993 and 1994 District Conventions, and 1993 District Bowling Tournament.

Registration continued on Saturday morning, October 24th and a complementary Continental Breakfast was was served untill 8:30 A.M.

District Governor Gordon Hoffman called the General Assembly of the Convention to order at 8:30 A.M.

Immediate Past District Governor Robert Showers led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chaplain Earl Buchholz gave a prayer. He then led the singing of "I Got That Lions Spirit".

Convention Chairman P.D.G. Clem Schoenborn welcomed all to the convention and made several announcements.

D.G. Gordon Hoffman introduced International Director Garnet Davis of Melfort, Saskachewan, Canada. Davis was substituting for I.D. Roger Richert of Bellevue, Washington who had to cancel his visit on Wednesday of this week because of the death of his father.

District Elections Chairman, Lion Karen Koch outlined the procedure for voting this afternoon.

PDG Dwaine Habrat and IPDG Robert Showers reported on the ambulance Project. They advised that an ambulance has been purchased and is on display in front of the hotel. The "Mission to Mexico" will leave February 21st after the ambulance is loaded with 15,000 pair of used eye glasses and other medical supplies. They expect 15 to 17 people to take part in the mission, but could use 30. They asked for continued support of the ambulance project for next year.

D.G. Hoffman advised that the entries for the trading pin contest and peace poster contest are posted in the voting area.

Lensometer Chairman, IPDG Showers gave the lensometer report. The lensometer has been purchased and is housed at the Butte des Morts Lions Club House. Additional used eye glasses are needed.

Zone Chairman Mark Heller gave an up-date report on plans for the 1993 State Convention which will be hosted by the Two Rivers Lions Club and 16 other Lions Clubs in the Manitowoc County area. Past International President William L. Woolard will be the speaker.

Nominations with seconds were made for 1993 District Convention Cities on behalf of Manitowoc Lions, Two Rivers Lions and Mishicot Lions; and for 1994 District Convention City on behalf of the Green Lake Lions.

A nomination and second for 1993 District Bowling Host City was made on behalf of the New Holstein Lions.

PDG Schneider said the use of separate checks for each cause or fund helps greatly for the tabulation. D.G. Hoffman thanked PDG's Schneider and Thorson for handling the parade of checks.

Convention Chairman Clem Schoenborn advised that 316 persons ate during the Honor Banquet and 328 ate during the noon luncheon. He added that no one was turned away.

A round of applause was given for the Cleveland Lions Club and their chairman on a good job planning and handling the convention.

In response to a question, Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer Orv Doede said 18 Lions Clubs had no certified delegates at this convention.

Tail Twister, Lion Irv Korth reported receipts of \$448.58 during the convention. Applause.

#### Minutes of Business Meeting

This was a joint meeting with the Cabinet of District 27-B2. It opened with an assembly of both Cabinets.

District Governor Gordon Hoffman welcomed everyone and advised that he and District Governor Rudy Messar of 27-B2 have corsages for presentation to all the Ladies.

All Lions in attendance then introduced themselves and their Sweethearts.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by IPDG Robert Showers. A prayer was presented by Chaplain Earl Buchholz. Song Leader Earl Buchholz led "God Bless America".

The members of each Cabinet then moved to their separate meetings.

District Governor Gordy advised that he received a communication from Lions Clubs International advising that they question the qualifications of District Governor Elect Ken Rohde. DG Gordy sent Lions International several documents to support the qualifications of DGE Ken but the officials at Lions International still do not give their approval.

Yesterday, DG Gordy met with International Director Donald McGee and Past International Director Helmer Lecy to discuss the situation. He was advised to obtain unanimous vote of approval and support for DGE Ken and have everyone in attendance sign their name and position on a sheet of paper. He was further advised to send these items with a cover letter to Lions Clubs International with copies to International Directors Harry Merriman, Garnet Davis and Donald McGee. PDG Clem Schoenborn distributed copies of the final report on the 1992 District Convention. He explained the report and answered several questions. The host club profit on the convention was \$1,632.81

ZC Mark Heller reported on plans and problems for the 1993 State Convention at Two Rivers. He said, the only rooms remaining are 51 condo villas at Fox Hills near Mishicot.

PDG Paul Tadych advised that the latest information on the 1993 International Convention is outlined in the convention up date published in the District Governor's February newsletter.

IPDG Bob Showers and PDG Dwaine Habrat informed us that they will depart for Mexico with the Ambulance on Sunday, February 21st. Five persons from our District, Lions Bob and Dwaine, ZC Orville Kittel, his wife Anna and a Lioness from Eldorado. It was agreed that Lions Bob and Dwaine use their discretion for the purchase of items to give to children during their stops along the way.

PDG Tom Thorson outlinned plans for the USA/Canada Leadership Forum to be held in Winston Salem, North Carolina September 9 through 11. He up dated us on efforts to have Milwaukee selected for the 1996 Forum and said a decision will be made in April.

He said there are several areas which require revisions and explained the process for accomplishing the revisions.

PDG Dwaine also informed us about resolutions being considered by the State Constitution & ByLaws committee and said resolutions to be voted on at the State Convention will be published in the April issue of the State Lions Magazine.

Diabetes Chairman Carl Knox said he has a new VHS tape program tracking the interaction of the ADA and a four year old boy learning to cope with his new diabetes. So far 32 Clubs have contributed to Diabetes.

Lion Sandy Polzin reported on the State Bowling Tournament which is now underway in Chippewa Falls. 319 teams, 773 singles and 1,545 doubles are registered. She said the \$.50 generated from the entry fees for 1993 for the Bowling Committee will be returned to the bowlers in prize money.

Pin Chairman, RC John Damrow informed us that the 1993 District pins have not arrived, but he expects delivery any day. Lion John does have about 300 1990 pins and about 500 1991 pins. The 1992 pins are gone. Motion by PDG Bob Showers, seconded by PDG Tom Koch to sell the 1993 District pins for \$1.75 per pin in quanities of less than 100 and for \$1.50 per pin for orders of 100 or more pins. Motion carried. Lion John said he must have the money before shipping or delivering pins.

Drug and Alcohol Abuse Chairman PDG Paul Tadych stated that some school districts are building the costs of the Lions Quest program into their budgets and don't ask the Lions Clubs for assistance. He advised that there is support money available out there from captured drug monies, and some schools are taking advantage of this as well.

DG Gordy Hoffman noted that our International Relations Chairman, Past International Director Edward Eick recently passed away and DG Gordy asked everyone to stand for a moment of silence.

Journey for Sight Chairman, PDG Paul Tadych and Lion Carl Knox told about a Journey for Sight being sponsored by the Appleton Evening Lions Club on March 13th at the Avenue Mall in Appleton. They are inviting other Lions Clubs to participate.

PDG Paul Tadych briefed us on the District organization and plans for Campaign SightFirst and the Used Eye Glasses Program. Our District Coordinator is PDG Bob Showers, who recently has been trained and is now recruiting Group Coordinators.

PDG Glenn Murty, our Leader Dog Chairman is at home, recuperating from his recent illness. Lion Glenn submitted a written report advising that so far, only 36 Lions Clubs and 10 Lioness Clubs have contributed to Leader Dog. He wrote that a lady from our District is training at Leader Dog School today and expressed the hope that by the end of the State Convention in May our District will again be 100% for Leader Dog.

DG Gordy Hoffman pointed out that PDG Glenn Murty has attended 98 consecutive cabinet meetings before missing this meeting. DG Gordy passed around a card for all attendees to sign for Lion Glenn.

IPDG Bob Showers said we have been grading used eye glasses at the Lions Camp and have been holding training sessions on our lensometer at the Butte des Morts Lions Club House. He added that we need to get the word out to the Clubs and get Lions to come and work with the used eye glasses program. Used eye glasses should not be sent to Wausau; they should be given to one of our Foundation Directors or to some one who will get them to the Lions Camp or to Butte des Morts. Lion Bob had a handout which explains the proceedure for scheduling volunteers who wish to come to Butte des Morts to work on this program.

Lioness Liaison, Lion Steve Buchanan said they are trying to form a Lioness Club in the Coloma-Hancock-Plainfield area.

Membership Orientation & Retention Chairman, PDG Tom Koch informed us about the current membership figures for our District. He pointed out that membership development, orientation and retention will be topics for the May 8th sessions in Fond du Lac.

Public Relations Chairman, Lion Peter Gregouire distributed copies of an ad he has run regarding the donation of wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, electric wheelchairs, neck braces, leg braces, arm slings, and etc. to local Lions Clubs. #### Minutes of Business Meeting

DG Gordy up dated us on the latest developments regarding the State Convention which will be hosted by the Two Rivers Lions Club and other Lions and Lioness Clubs in the Two Rivers, Manitowoc, Mishicot area.



#### REQUIREMENTS FOR 100% SECRETARY'S AWARD - 1992

- 1. All M&A Reports must be mailed by the last day of month in order to reach Lions International, District Governor, Region Chairman and Zone Chairman no later than the 5th of the following month.
- 2. All District and International dues and all CLUB supply billings be given to Club Officers for payment within 10 days of receipt. Payment must be within 30 days of receipt of billing.
- 3. There must be no club indebtedness owed to Lions International or the District which would make club delegates ineligible to vote at either the State or International Convention.
- 4. The PU101 Form must be properly filled out showing the newly elected President, Secretary, and Treasurer and must be completed as required and submitted no later than April 30, 1992 to Lions International and the District Governor.
- 5. All delegate forms and cards must be completed and submitted by May 1 for the State Convention.
- 6. The Secretary must attend at least two Zone Meetings held in his Zone during the current year.
- 7. At least one of the following requirements must be fulfilled:
  - a. Attended the District Officers Training Seminar
  - b. Attended the District Convention
- 8. The Club Secretary must be recommended for this award by either his respective Region Chairman or Zone Chairman with final approval by the District Governor.
- 9. Any of the above rules may be waived by the District Governor if he is advised of conditions which exist beyond the control of the Secretary.



## Greetings from the District Governor,

I would like to remind the Club Secretaries that it is very important that you get the M&A reports to the District Governor and to the Region and Zone Chairman on time by the 5th of the following month.

All those who attended the Milt Wood Appreciation Day on July 11 had a great time honoring a very deserving Lion. I enjoy receiving the many Club Newsletters. Keep them coming. If you have an upcoming event, please let me know at least six weeks ahead of time and I will include it in my upcoming events calendar.

Our 27-B1 District Convention is just a little over two months away so inform all of your Clubs of the following information: Candidate forms for those running for the following offices and sites: District Governor, Lt. Governor, WLF Director, and District Convention Site (Region 4) must be received by Election Chairman, Karen Koch, and the District Governor 30 days prior to the first day of the District Convention (Oct. 23). Bowling bids (Region 2) must be received by Sandy Polzin by Sept. 1. Any resolutions must be sent to the Constitution and By-Laws Chairman PDG Dwaine Habrat immediately so that he may have them back out to the Clubs 30 days prior to the first day of the Convention. You will find all Convention forms enclosed in this newsletter. Fill them out and send them back in with your check as soon as possible so that the Convention Committee can get reservations lined up.

At the 1992 International Convention in Hong Kong a Constitutional Amendment was approved so that as of October 1, 1992, the Board of Directors is empowered to levy a carrying charge on past due Club Account balances. There will be a 1% per month charge on any portion of an account that is past due 60 days or longer. Club treasurers, please take notice of this new Amendment.

#### An Environment for Peace

Children ages 11, 12 or 13 are eligible to enter the fifth annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest—however, all contests must be sponsored by a Lions club.

Entrants are asked to express the theme "An Environment for Peace" in an original poster. Last year, 300,000 children from over 60 countries took part.

#### **How To Enter**

Clubs planning to participate in the 1992-93 contest should order an official Peace Poster Contest kit immediately from the Public Relations Division at headquarters (see order form, below). Kits are available in all official languages for US\$25, complete.

Each peace poster kit contains all the necessary materials for administering the contest in one school, including:

- Official rules for the club and school
- •Suggestions for encouraging participation in local schools and promoting the contest in the community
- Two posters to hang in the school to promote the contest
- Press release sample for local media
- •Label for identifying winning poster
- Mailing tube and label to forward winning entry to next level of competition
- •District governor notice of participation postcard

Kits must be ordered immediately to guarantee sufficient time for a well-planned contest. Note that orders will not be processed after October 1, 1992.

Keep in mind that deadlines are critical, and that any entries missing deadlines must be disqualified.

#### **How The Contest Works**

Clubs should locate a local school interested in participating and then order a contest kit. Once a school is selected and the local competition begins, the Lions club, or school must select only **one winner per school** to advance to the next level of competition (any club can sponsor more than one school, if desired). The school winner then advances to district competition where **one winner** is selected by the district governor. All district winners advance to multiple district competition where **one winner** then advances to finalist judging.

#### **Prizes**

One international Grand Prize Winner will receive US\$1,500 (or local equivalent), a commemorative plaque and a trip for the artist and two family members to New York City, to at-

tend Lions Day With The United Nations in March, 1993.

A total of 23 international Merit Award Winners will also be chosen, each receiving US\$250 and a special certificate. All international winners will be chosen by a distinguished panel of judges.

In addition, the president of the Grand Prize Winner's sponsoring Lions club will also receive a trip to New York City to attend Lions Day With The United Nations. The club and sponsoring school receive a plaque.

Lions are well known for their efforts toward international understanding. Create an environment for peace in your community through its children, and their vision for the future.

## Greetings from the District Governor,

This past month has been a very busy month attending Lions summer activities throughout the District. Betty and I have just returned from the scene of the devastating tornado in Wautoma. The scene was one that was unbelievable because of the vast destruction. Trees and wires were down everywhere. What were once homes were now just empty lots with debris scattered everywhere. By the time we were allowed into the area, the cleanup had begun. The path of the tornado was over 21 miles long and reached speeds up to 150-200 miles an hour, damaging over 500 homes and businesses and leaving 100 people homeless.

On the Monday after the tornado I contacted LCIF at Lions Clubs International . I asked for and received an emergency disaster relief grant for \$5000.00 to be used in the Wautoma disaster. The grant covers blankets, medical supplies, food and clothing. The money will be put into a special account at the M&I Bank in Wautoma and the Wautoma Lions will work with the people in the area who are desperately in need of help.

I would like to ask all of the clubs in the district to do their part in any way they can. At the present time they have more than enough food and clothing. What we need now is cash donations. If you would like to donate money, you can make out a check to the Wautoma Lions relief Fund, c/o your District Governor, 918 E. 4th St. Rd., Fond du Lac, WI. 54935.

On August 14, Betty and I, along with the Council of Governors toured Lions Club International Headquarters in Oak Brook, Ill. It was a very interesting tour because we got to see the inner workings of Lions International. Then on August 15, we were all flown out of Chicago to Detroit, Michigan, where we were met by members of Leader Dog, who escorted us to the Leader Dog facilities in Rochester, Michigan. Here we had a lunch and a short meeting with President Wm. Hansen. The rest of the day we were shown how students work with their dogs. The following day we were blindfolded and led around by a leader dog and his trainer. It was quite an experience. We got a first hand look at what our donations to Leader Dog do. It now cost over \$11,000 for a leader dog. At the banquet Saturday night, District 27-B1 was one of just a few Districts that were presented with 100% donation to Leader Dog out of all the states that were in attendance.

Our District Convention is fast approaching, so get your registrations in as soon as possible. Forms are found with this newsletter. I have just received confirmation that our speaker at the banquet Saturday night will be International Director Roger Richert from Bellevue, WA. We have also received bids for all offices and sites to be voted on. The seminars are all set and everything seems to be in order for a great convention to be hosted by the Cleveland Lions.








# Fifth Annual Peace Poster Contest

#### An Environment for Peace

Children have a unique vision of our world. Capture their creativity and stimulate their imagination through a local Peace Poster Contest, sponsored by your club.

Children ages 11, 12 or 13 are eligible to enter the fifth annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest—however, all contests must be sponsored by a Lions club.

Entrants are asked to express the theme "An Environment for Peace" in an original poster. Last year, 300,000 children from over 60 countries took part.

#### How To Enter

Clubs planning to participate in the 1992-93 contest should order an official Peace Poster Contest kit immediately from the Public Relations Division at headquarters (see order form, below). Kits are available in all official languages for US\$25, complete.

Each peace poster kit contains all the necessary materials for administering the contest in one school, including:

- Official rules for the club and school
- •Suggestions for encouraging participation in local schools and promoting the contest in the community
- •Two posters to hang in the school to promote the contest
- •Press release sample for local media
- •Label for identifying winning poster
- Mailing tube and label to forward winning entry to next level of competition
- •District governor notice of participation postcard

Kits must be ordered immediately to guarantee sufficient time for a well-planned contest. Note that orders will not be processed after October 1, 1992.

Keep in mind that deadlines are critical, and that any entries missing deadlines must be disqualified.

How The Contest Works

Clubs should locate a local school interested in participating and then order a contest kit. Once a school is selected and the local competition begins, the Lions club, or school must select only **one winner per school** to advance to the next level of competition (any club can sponsor more than one school, if desired). The school winner then advances to district competition where **one winner** is selected by the district governor. All district winners advance to multiple district competition where **one winner** then advances to finalist judging.

#### Prizes

One international Grand Prize Winner will receive US\$1,500 (or local equivalent), a commemorative plaque and a trip for the artist and two family members to New York City, to at-

tend Lions Day With The United Nations in March, 1993.

A total of 23 international Merit Award Winners will also be chosen, each receiving US\$250 and a special certificate. All international winners will be chosen by a distinguished panel of judges.

In addition, the president of the Grand Prize Winner's sponsoring Lions club will also receive a trip to New York City to attend Lions Day With The United Nations. The club and sponsoring school receive a plaque.

Lions are well known for their efforts toward international understanding. Create an environment for peace in your community through its children, and their vision for the future.





Dear District Governors,

This afternoon I received telephone call from John Valencik, of the Convention Division at Lions Clubs International.

Wisconsin headquarters will be the Raddisson Inn-St. Paul. It is located in downtown St. Paul. One hundred four (104) rooms have been allotted for Wisconsin. The rate is \$86 per night for either a single or double. This is a class A hotel and has adequate function space. The Minnesota Grand Ballroom seats 1400 and there is also a Governor's Ballroom which seats 600. The Illinois Lions will also have a number of rooms at this property.

Four or five blocks away we have also been allotted another one hundred eighty five (185) rooms at the Civic Center Inn, also in downtown St. Paul. These rooms are \$66.00 per night for either a single or double occupancy.

Both of the rates quoted above do not include tax.

As of September 17 the Convention Division has received housing requests from 165 Wisconsin Lions.

As all of you are aware rooms are assigned on a first come, first served basis.

Mr. Valencik indicated the importance of requesting function space at an early date as to assure its availability.

We will be requesting space for both our Wisconsin Breakfast and our reception in honor of International Director, Harry Merriman. Our breakfast is normally on Thursday morning, however the date and time of the reception has not been determined.

He was presented with International President's Certificate of Appreciation in 1961 and was a Melvin Jones Fellow. Lion Eddie attended District, State and International Conventions.





The Committee is looking forward to a large turn out and we are asking that each club help promote this seminar so that hopefully we will have representation from each Lions and Lioness Club.


#### STATE CONVENTION UP DATE

# Wisconsin Lions Mission To Central America

Excitement reigns as we close the gap to the day we go on this Lions humanitarian trip.

There are still a lot of loose ends but I'll outline what is positive and tell you the possibilities of the details that we are unsure of to date.

A group of Indiana Lions just came back from a like mission on Friday, November 27, and I have talked with some of them. There is a lot of similarities in our plans and all went well for them, and as planned.

To date, we do have three ambulances, one each from 27-B1; 27-C1; and 27-E1. These vehicles will meet at the I90- & I43 highway interchange at 8:00 a.m. on Sunday, February 21, 1993. We may have one or two cars also driving with us. We will drive to the St. Louis area on day 1; On day 2 we will drive to the Tulsa area; on day 3 we will stop in or near Temple, Texas area (that's about 40 miles south of Waco) and on day 4 we'll be in McAllen or on Wednesday night, February 24.

The Lions of Mexico, District B-7 will meet us in McAllen on Thursday a.m. February 25. The will take over the ambulances and will have a bus to drive us to the Tuxpan area where we will work the Eye Glass program.

The trip to Tuxpan is approximately 500 miles and it is up to the Lions in Mexico to determine if they want to do this trip non-stop or if we stay a night somewhere on the way. The roads in Mexico are bad and the travel is slow.

Whatever those Lions decide, we will spend Saturday, February 27 presenting our ambulances and supplies to whoever the District Governors and our USA Liaison decide should get them. These presentations will be rather formal and colorful presentations, and we want to all be involved. We will then proceed to a pre-determined village and dispense the eye glasses, we'll be ready to go to work on Monday morning, February 28. We will work this program for four days, allowing time on the fourth day, Wednesday, March 23, to get back to Tuxpan.



#### Greetings from the District Governor,

# ATTENTION ALL LIONS DISTRICT 27B1 HELP!



The Lensometer that the district bought is at the Butte Des Morts club house. It is available to be used and there will be people there to teach you how to use it so the eyeglasses prescription can be marked on a sticker which is stuck on the plastic bag they are put into. It is best to have 3 to 6 people at a time, that way, everyone can have a chance to learn how to use the Lensometer. When you teach people it will be slow, as you use it more, it gets faster. So the more time you have on the Lensometer, the faster you will get. We will also have to wash and dry the glasses before they are read. Then they are put in a box to be taken to the Lions Camp and separated and put into a box with the different prescriptions on them. At first the instructor has a lot to watch over, and when everyone knows how and you don't need him anymore he can relax a little. You have to make a reservation for the club house because the Butte Des Morts has their Lions' meetings on the 2nd and 4th Wed. of the month. The 2nd Tuesday of the month is booked, day and night. Every Monday is also booked day and night.

There will also be other clubs that will want to learn how to use the Lensometer too. So, if any club wants to go, I will go along and be the instructor or there will be one at the club house. You can call the District Tail Twister, Irv Korth at his home a 414-235-1507 or you can call me, Orville Kittel, at 414-294-3526. If you called Irv, he could tell you at that time if the club house is available.

Lions, we spent a lot of money for the Lensometer; it would be a big let down if it just stood there and wasn't used. There are three Districts set up to read glasses, one is in Indiana, one in California, and the other is in Wisconsin. So clubs from all over the United States will be sending used glasses to these places to be washed, read, labeled, sorted and shipped. I don't think that Rosholt can do all this by themselves. They need your help to preform this giant task. The retired Lions and there wives can come in the day time and the other Lions when they have time, or at

night. I will do my best to make my schedule fit yours.



We had **NO PROBLEMS** with our ambulance, but there were breakdowns with the other vehicles. This did make for an exciting trip and brought our group closer together.

We had a great deal of trouble with the Mexican customs, and had to stay in McAllen Texas for three nights. After lengthy negotiations with the Mexican authorities we found it is best to deal with Mexico City before leaving from Wisconsin. The paperwork would then be with us before we leave from Wisconsin.

The Tuxpan, Veracruz Lions club consisted of 28 members and they were gracious hosts. The 29 of us from Wisconsin fit about 4000 people with eyeglasses. We were told that people were lined up days before we arrived and while we were there the line never seemed to die down. Our regret was that we could not stay longer and help more people. We also needed a larger supply of graded eyeglasses and so I urge you to become involved with recycling eyeglasses at the Butte des Morts Lions clubhouse.

A special thanks to the people from our District who joined us in Mexico for this humanitarian project. Orv and Ana Kittel from the Berlin Lions, Paul and Jean Riesen from the Packwaukee Lions, Marjorie Guell from the Eldorado Lioness

# Answering Your Questions: Campaign SightFirst

- **Q:** As a Lion, what should Campaign SightFirst (CSF) mean to me?
- A: It means I am part of an historic program to help conquer blindness in the world!

  My association is doing something that has never been done before, and that no other organization has been able to do.
- **Q:** Why is CSF different from other projects our association has undertaken?
- A: We have never asked all of our membership, clubs and districts to work together over a three year period to accomplish so much—to actually eliminate preventable blindness in much of the world.
- **Q:** What is the relationship between SightFirst and Campaign SightFirst
- A: SightFirst implements programs to cure blindness and Campaign SightFirst raises funds to make SightFirst programs possible.
- **Q:** How does CSF relate to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF)?
- A: LCIF is the fundraising and humanitarian arm of our association. CSF is part of LCIF, but seeks new money to eliminate preventable blindness. Naturally, its support must come from all of Lions Clubs International.
- **U:** NEW MONEY: What is that?
- A: Support for CSF should be over and above what is given to LCIF so that LCIF can continue funding essential grants for other worthy causes.

- Q: What is the CSF goal?
- A: US\$130 million is the campaign goal.

  More could be accomplished with another
  US\$70 million.
- **Q:** Why does the campaign last for three years?
- A: US\$130 million is a lot of money! It takes time to build a worldwide campaign organization and motivate 1.4 million Lions and 40,000 clubs. We are now just beginning. We will celebrate victory at our 1994 international convention.
- Q: How should my club be helping CSF?
- A: Be sure your leaders read the CSF material sent to your club and that they inform all members about the contents. Our objective is to make sure that every Lion worldwide is informed and ready to support CSF.
- Q: Should we raise money for CSF this year?
- A: Of course! Raise all you can, just as you did last year. But next year, fiscal year 1993-94, is the most important and by then all district and zone leadership will be in place. In this final year we will raise the majority of funds to reach our goal.
- **Q:** How will clubs that raise significant money be recognized?
- A: Three banner patches will be available.
- Clubs that raised US\$1,000 or more last year (1991-92) received the Lions Conquering Blindness CSF award

- patch. Those that raise US\$1,500 or more will receive the award patch for 1992-93.
- 2. The five clubs in each district that achieve the highest per capita giving in each of the three fiscal years will receive the district "Top Five" award patch for that year.
- 3. The one club in each district that achieves the highest per capita giving to CSF for the period of July 1, 1992 through June 30, 1994 will receive the International Committee award patch.
- **Q:** Are Melvin Jones Fellowships available to CSF donors?
- A: Yes! All CSF donors whose gift (US\$1,000) would qualify as a MJF are entitled to receive the MJF recognition.
- **Q:** My club contributes to a local sight-related project. Can these funds be considered as part of CSF?
- A: CSF raises funds for specific projects approved by the SF Proposal Review Committee. CSF funds must be sent through customary LCIF channels.
- **Q:** Is it true that anything Lions do to prevent blindness worldwide is defined as "SightFirst"?
- A: Yes. However, Campaign SightFirst raises funds ONLY for specific projects approved by the Proposal Review Committee. Lions are currently contributing a tremendous sum of money to many sight-related
